- * **Named Clothing** As mentioned above, please ensure all items of clothing are named (especially jumpers and coats).
- * Homework Homework is set every Friday and due on a Wednesday. It directly correlates to what we are covering in class at the moment, and can be from either English, Maths, RE or Topic. Spellings are set on Friday for a test on Thursday. There will be no spellings or homework set the first week back.
- * Snacks As your child is now in KS2, they are no longer entitled to a free fruit snack provided by the school. If your child wishes to have a snack at break time they are welcome to bring one in from home (fruit or vegetables only please).
