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

#### **Staffing Update**

#### Log Trail

The children at St Joseph's are so incredibly lucky to have the use of a new and high quality log trail on our grounds. It was installed in May 2022 after a great deal of work from the School Council and PTA. It was funded by an incredibly generous donation from the OOSC, monies raised by the PTA, and donations from the school governors and Pre-School. The equipment has an annual safety check and is regularly checked by our SBM who is responsible for Health and Safety.

When in school the children have a set of rules that they follow. They were introduced by the School Council to keep the children safe. All children know them, are expected to follow them, and are reminded about them at the start of the year. Our reception children are currently being taught how to play on the equipment safely.

At 3.20pm, when the teachers send the children to their parents at the end of the school day, the children become their responsibility. It is lovely to see so many children enjoying extra time on the log trail after school, however, we often see behaviour on the equipment that we would not see during school time.

Following on from a couple of incidents that have happened after school, the School Council will be reviewing the rules as one of their first jobs, updating the children and then they will send them to you all so that you can see what is expected of the children during school time. It would be great if while supervising your child/children on the equipment after school that you could remind them that the rules still apply.

#### **Read with Me**

We are so lucky to be working with Read with Me. They are a local charity who support reading in primary schools. All of their volunteers are trained not only to listen but to check for comprehension. During Health Week last term, as one of our activities, we joined in their sponsored fun run, raising money to train more volunteers. I can't thank the families enough that supported this event.
