Bullying is:

When a person or a group behaves in ways—on purpose and over and over—that make someone feel hurt, afraid or embarrassed.

It is important to distinguish bullying from other unkind, mean and harmful behaviour.

Bullying is not:

Calling someone a name or pushing someone once, being rude or having an argument with someone.

The really important message to all is that bullying will not be tolerated – children need to speak out to stay safe.

Stroud Book Festival

The children had fun last week when they spent time on line with this year's authors Eloise Smith, Sufiya Ahmed, Louie Stowell and Sarah Coyle. I would like to thank Mrs Knight for organising this event again and to you all for supporting this event for your children and to those of you who bought them the focus book and have been sharing it at home. These really are high quality enriching curriculum experiences.

Reading Rewards

There has been much discussion around the reading rewards both amongst parents and with school staff too. We thought it would be helpful for all to clarify how the points work.

I think that we can all agree that the most important skill that our children learn is to read. This was set up to encourage and support reading at home and reward the efforts of children. The hope from us is that all children will read at home 5 times a week – this is not just in term time but over the holidays too. Points are awarded for as follows:

- √ 5 reads in 1 week
- ✓ If a child reads daily (ie 7 times in a calendar week) the points will continued to be counted and rolled on
- √ 1 'read' will be awarded per day of reading (If a child reads 3 times in 1 day this counts as 1 read)
- ✓ Reading points over school breaks will be counted except for the summer holidays
 when the diaries are collected in
- ✓ Children from R to Year 4 are expected to read school books
- ✓ In Year 5/6, children's teachers will discuss with them, when appropriate, whether they are able to read books from home instead of school books.

I hope that this clarifies reading rewards. You may see some changes to the way that the points are awarded in some classes. I am sure that you can imagine tracking of this nature is time consuming and this adds additional work load for our staff, but they are willing to do this because the children love these rewards and see anything that encourages reading as a good thing. By numbering your child's reads (ideally1-5) supports the class teacher in tracking the points. Thank you all for supporting your children with this vital life-long skill.
