Attendance

At the start of the year a few days off make a big difference to your child's attendance. At this point in the term, if your child has had 2 days off – they will be dropping just below 90% - they are classed as persistently absent. Any child who has had more days off, eg 5 days is around 75% attendance. We have had several children with the odd day off due to illness and whilst they are on the absence tracker, we are carefully monitoring in the hope that this figure now starts to increase. If the % drop further, we will get in touch with you to let you know.
