#### **Bake Sale to raise money for the Convent**

We are so proud of the Year 5 boys Arthur, Austin, Callum, Finley, Finn, Jake and James for their hard work and commitment in making the cake sale a success. The boys have been planning this since September. Setting the date, advertising, emailing parents to enlist support. Their enthusiasm and commitment has been really impressive. And, what a great way to end a rainy Friday and to round off Anti-Bullying Week. I would also like to thank the boy's parents for supplying cakes, all of the other parents who also sent in cakes to support this event and the parents who sent their children to school with money to buy a cake. The boys raised an amazing £151.35.

The timing could not be better for the Sisters – In June, their water pump broke down and when the Engineer from Eko Flow came to fix it, he told them that the pump being more than 30 years old has lived out its lifespan and needed to be replaced. They were given a quote for it but didn't have the fund for the replacement, so they pleaded with him to repair it. In September again, the water pump broke down. They called the company again and the engineer was able to fix one of the pumps but one has permanently gone. He told them that if the one he fixed broke down again, they wouldn't be able to fix it, they need to replace it – the quote for replacement is £13,200 – a sum of money that the Convent does not have. So, the boys' money will go to supporting the fundraising that they are doing for this. Thank you.

# LOOK WHO'S TALKING! 2026

An Oracy Competition for Gloucestershire's Infant, Junior and Primary Schools

Our school is very excited to be taking part in the 'Look Who's Talking!' competition, along with lots of other schools in Gloucestershire!

#### WHAT IS ORACY AND WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT?

Oracy is the ability to express ourselves clearly and communicate with others effectively, through spoken language.

By teaching our children to become more effective speakers and listeners, we are all helping to give them the tools they need to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them.

#### HOW WILL THE COMPETITION WORK?

Your child will get the chance to talk to their class for two minutes, about any subject that they choose and then a 'Star Speaker' will be chosen. Star Speakers from every class will then get to talk in front of the whole school. Those winners will then go on to the next stage and will represent our school in the competition, with lots of other local schools! The grand final will be on 04.04.25, which you can come to, if your child is a representative for our locality.

#### WHAT CAN YOUR CHILD TALK ABOUT?

Children can talk about <u>absolutely anything</u> that they choose to, for <u>up to two-minutes</u> They can use any props that they wish to, which will help with their talk, but just cannot use any technology, so no Powerpoint slide shows please.

#### HOW CAN YOU HELP THEM AT HOME?

- \* First of all, please help them to think about what they would like to talk about. The more interested they are in the subject, the more passionate their talk will be! What are they interested in? What excites them? It might be a toy, their pet, a book, something they have seen on TV, their favourite sports team, something they have learned about from you at home or anything else! It really can be anything at all!
- They will need to plan and rehearse their speech, so please listen to them practice and give them lots of encouragement!
- ★ Make sure they are speaking with big voices, nice and clearly, so everyone can hear their talk and learn about their chosen topic.



#### **Attendance**

We have 15 children on the tracker at the moment. Just as a reminder – if your child's attendance drops below 90% they are considered to be persistently absent (PA). When that happens, you will receive a call from the school to let you know. Their attendance is then closely monitored. As their attendance improves, they become green on the tracker - indicating that their attendance is improving – moving them out of the PA category. Any further absence will lead to them being red - they are moving in the wrong direction. This will lead to further communication with parents and potentially an attendance meeting if necessary.
