To all of our mums, we hope that you had a lovely Mothering Sunday. The message from Fr Philip to our Reception and Year 6 children in Mass was that Mothering Sunday is far greater than Mothers Day...it stretches to all of the people in our lives who love and care for us.

What a difference the sunshine and longer days make, although I am struggling to believe that we won't see more rain and mud before the better weather is here for good! Please remember when sending your child to school that it is always cooler in Nympsfield and there is generally a wind blowing across the school, a coat is still definitely still needed at the moment!

Year 6 SATs meeting

Thank you to all of the parents who bought the CGP 10 minutes practise SATs books. We know how busy a holiday can be but if you can find time for those daily, your child will really reap the benefits when they come back to school after Easter.

Times Tables

I know that times tables were a topic of conversation during the Year 4 parent's evenings this term. As for Year 6 – the Easter Holidays are a great opportunity to practise that times tables fluency. Whilst this is in preparation for the MTC at the beginning of June, this is not only relevant for Year 4 children.....

Why are tables so important?

When children know their times tables, mental arithmetic becomes easier. Practising times tables also helps children to understand number and number relationships, and to see patterns in numbers. These skills will help them to master key concepts and move quickly through more complex maths problems with confidence.

What are the benefits of learning multiplication tables?

Key advantages include:

- Application in daily life
- Integral to developing basic mathematical building blocks
- Building confidence with more complex tasks
- Gaining a conceptual understanding of multiplication and deeper thinking process
- Improving problem-solving abilities
- Developing key skills and 'number sense'

Tables are like reading, daily and often support children to learn and remember them. Whilst I started talking about Year 4, by the end of **Year 2** – your child should be fluent in the **2**, **5** and **10** times tables. By the end of **Year 3**, they should be fluent in **2**, **5**, **10**, **3**, **4** and **8**.

You cannot underestimate the impact that this has on a child's ability to confidently tackle mathematical problems as they move up through the school. Your support of your child in learning these basic number facts will have a lasting impact on their ability to learn.

Summer Uniform

After Easter we hope the weather continues to warm up and the children are able to come back to school in summer uniform.

Golden yellow checked dress, grey v-neck pullover or cardigan with school badge, white socks, black shoes (no trainers or sandals).

White polo shirt with school badge, trousers or shorts, grey socks and black school shoes (no trainers).

Year 5 and 6

Golden yellow checked dress or white polo shirt with school badge, grey skirt, trousers or shorts, white socks and black shoes (no trainers or sandals).

White polo shirt with school badge, trousers or shorts, grey socks and black school shoes (no trainers).

A reminder about PE Kit

Sports Uniform

Navy shorts, house coloured t-shirt, white sport socks, black plimsoll/trainers, navy tracksuit bottoms, navy school hoodie.

Alternative sports: Hooded tops NO ZIPS, NO STRIPES OR BRANDING PLEASE.

Any alternative sportswear should not have a zip up the front, have any stripes or branding please.

We have also noticed an increase in interesting hair accessories and nail varnish, so as a reminder:

Jewellery, hair accessories, nail varnish and tattoos are not to be worn at school. Anything that is worn in a child's hair should be in school colours and modest, no big bows, clips or hairbands.

If earrings are being worn, due to health and safety reasons, only one set of small studs are acceptable. They should be removed for PE lessons.

Thank you for your support in ensuring that your child comes to school dressed in the correct uniform, smart and ready for their day of learning, it also saves staff having to speak to children and adults about school uniform expectations.

The children came back buzzing from the experience. Their performance will have been judged and scored. There are many other rounds to go, so we will have to wait and see how well they did over all.

This is a great example of the additional opportunities that our children get at St Joseph's and they have been so lucky to have been prepared for the trial by a barrister! Thank you so much Mrs Connolly for the generous amount of time that you gave up to help our children be ready for the case, this additional preparation meant that they benefitted so much more form this experience.
