Attendance Matters

As you know, there is a government campaign to improve school attendance across the country. When children get to 90% they are considered to be persistently absent (PA). At this point we carefully monitor certain children's attendance by adding them to a tracker. We have been informing parents and with their support we have made a huge difference to the number of children that we are monitoring. I would like to thank you all for your support and for improving your child's attendance.

All parents were given their child/children's attendance for this year at parents evening before the Easter Holidays. Please see the diagram below to see where your child's attendance is considered to be.



Lateness impacts on your child's learning too, a child that walks into school at 8.50am will be 5 minutes late for their first lesson. If they are late on a regular basis they are missing 25 minutes of reading in a week. Please help us to help your child/ren to be confident in this vital skill by ensuring your child/ren are in their classrooms ready to learn by 8.50am.
