Chaplaincy and School Council News



Exciting news for the Chaplaincy Team and School Council... some of you will be aware that there has been an ongoing project of a school prayer garden that the teams have been working on together. The School Council, over time with a variety of Fundraising ideas have managed to raise just over £700.



The Central Team of the MAT recently put in a bid to a charity to get funding for some new resources to support the life and mission of our school. Part of that bid was some money toward the making of our prayer garden. The bid was successful and they have donated an amazing £1450. SEND Review

One of the MAT strategies is around SEND provision across the schools in our MAT, looking at best practise and executive functioning skills. Chris Johnson, a very experienced SENDCo for St Thomas More, spent last Monday with Mrs Guoite, Mrs Ponting and myself, reviewing our SEND provision at St Joseph's. The day went quickly and it was lovely to receive this email from him following his visit:

"Thank you so much for welcoming me yesterday to your lovely school. It was a pleasure to see all the great things going on. The classrooms looked amazing and lunchtimes are a treasure for children. They were so calm! The interventions delivered by the TA's were really engaging and the relationships they have built with the children really stood out. The TA's had an excellent knowledge of the children and how interventions clearly linked back to My Plan targets. The school are very lucky to have such a dedicated team to support the growth of children at St Joseph's."

We know how hard we work to do the very best for all children, ensuring they have equity in provision. I am incredibly lucky to have such a talented and dedicated team of reflective practitioners who go over and beyond to meet each individual child's needs, but it is always nice when experienced practitioners enjoy their time with us and appreciate the work that we do.


PE
