Hello and welcome to our first St Joseph's Reading Newsletter celebrating all things related to reading because it enables us to REACH and be the best we can be!


<u>Stroud Reading Festival November</u> 2022








Award winning

The Children's Book Award 2022 is the only national award voted for solely by children from start to finish. Over 1,000 new books are submitted to be read and reviewed by local Testing Groups across the country. When the shortlists are announced voting opens on the website for any child or school to participate in. Usually over 150,000 total votes are cast in the process. A brilliantly bonkers story about an octopus who lives on the roof. When a giant octopus arrives, the children LOVE their new friend; he makes the perfect slide and is fantastic at football! But some of the grown-ups aren't so pleased. Will they drive him away . . . or will they realise just how helpful an octopus can be?
