As always, we are especially proud of our children, who always strive to be the best they can be. We do know that we couldn't be the St Joseph's Family that we are without the support of our wonderful, dedicated staff, parents and carers. THANK YOU.

In January, we became part of The Little Way Catholic Educational Trust to secure our long-term future. All six Primary Schools across the Trust are working together, sharing expertise and, with a shared common goal, continuing to be successful as individual schools and as a Trust.

Our current number of pupils is not at PAN (published admissions number) and we would like to see them increase. Whilst we are a one-form entry village school, a growth in our pupil numbers would mean we would benefit from the additional 'per pupil' funding that would be received from Local Government. This, in turn, would enable us to fund additional resources, which would greatly benefit our children.

We are absolutely delighted to report that our new Reception class has attracted 22 children, which is above the average for schools in our locality. This is wonderful as we know that, given our location, the majority of pupils in our St Joseph's Family attend here out of choice, rather than catchment boundaries, and as a result of your recommendations; **thank you!** We would also like to thank the Leadership Team for showing new families around the school, and the staff in the office for arranging so many visits for prospective parents.

The Governors' role is to challenge and be a critical friend to the school. We, as Governors, continue to challenge and monitor to ensure that the high standards that have been achieved at St Joseph's continue to remain. The Governors are: Gabriella Tiley, Syd Gwyer, Nicola Connolly, Claire Wooldridge, Katharine Piper, Loraine Patrick and Clare Howells (ex officio). We are indebted to our clerk, Roger Slater, for his ongoing support and guidance.

The Governor role is a rewarding one. It allows an insight into the everyday running of St Joseph's and enables an oversight of our children's education. As a governing body, we each bring different skills to our Board and we enjoy acting upon our collective mission. Each of us has acquired new skills and expertise, transferrable into our professional and personal lives. We agree that whilst we dedicate our time, it is very much a two-way-street and very worthwhile.

The Governing Body meets once per term (i.e. six times per year). We meet in person, at school (sometimes meetings may be held remotely). Governor monitoring, per allocated role, is three times per year and is carried out at Governors' convenience (at a mutually agreed date and time).

We are not at capacity on our Governing Board. We do have vacancies and would love for you to think about joining us. You may not consider yourself to have enough time or, indeed, to have the relevant experience; but it is highly likely that you have both. You may not be aware, but many employers offer time off for an employee to carry out a role in governance.
